Page 10: WHAT IS A STATUS OFFENDER?

Correct statute is **NRS 62B.320**

Page 11: IS RESISTING ARREST ILLEGAL?

Correct statute is **NRS 199.280**

Pages 11-12: WHAT IS JUVENILE COURT?

Paragraphs should read:

Juvenile court is a special division of the district courts of Nevada. A district court judge acts as the juvenile court judge. Juvenile court is for young people under the age of 18 who have been referred for violating the law or who are in need of supervision.

You can be required to go to juvenile court if a petition is filed charging you to be a child:

- ~Who is beyond the control of parents and custodians;
- ~Who is believed to have violated any state or local laws;
- ~Who has run away from home;
- ~Who is a habitual truant. NRS 62B.320.

Page 13: WHAT IS THE DIVISION OF CHILD & FAMILY SERVICES?

3rd paragraph: You may be held in a DCFS facility until your **20th birthday** if the judge determines that it is necessary for further observation and care. Add **NRS 63.790**

Page 13: AS A JUVENILE CAN I BE SENT TO ADULT COURT?

3rd paragraph: If you are **16** or over and charged with committing certain violent crimes such as sexual assault or use of a weapon in committing crimes you will be charged as an adult.
NRS 62B.390

Page 14: CAN MY JUVENILE COURT RECORD BE SEALED OR DESTROYED?

Yes, juvenile records with limited exceptions, are sealed when you reach 21.

Page 47: WHAT IS THE SPEED LIMIT?

Nevada law generally sets a limit up to **65** miles per hour on the highways and **15** or 25 miles per hour in school crossing zones.

Page 48: DO I HAVE TO WEAR A SEAT BELT?

Child seat ...”Children under the age of 6 or **sixty** pounds (last sentence, change statute to **NRS 484.474**)

Page 51: WHERE DO I GET A WORK PERMIT?

Your County Department of Juvenile Justice Services issues **work permits**. This permit allows you to work outside school hours or during vacation periods. This involves completing an application which is available online and acquiring the verification that you are presently enrolled in school.

Page 51: HOW MANY HOURS A DAY MAY I WORK?

If you are under 16, you may not work more than **3 hours a day or up to 18 hours in any one week when school is in session** or more than eight hours in one day or up to **40 hours a week** when school is not in session. NRS 609.240, NRS 609.250
